Unitarian Universalist Fellowship to break ground

The Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Harford County will break ground for construction of a new meeting place on Route 22 between Bel Air and Churchville at 1 p.m. Sunday.

There will be refreshments, and the dedication of a barbecue pit built by the youth organization.

The Fellowship has been meeting at 210 Lee Way in Bel Air. Expansion at that site is impossible because of wetlands on the property, according to the Rev. Alice Blair Wesley.

Members purchased more than three acres from Walter and Maudeline Banks on Route 22 between Asbury and Corns roads in early 1993.

The Fellowship has sold the 210 Lee Way site to the New Life Christian Fellowship, but will continue meeting there through the coming year. Fall services begin Sept. 11, at 9:30 and 11:30 a.m.
